#### **FACTORS AND MULTIPLES**

- Identify some differences in the Caribbean culture and explain why these differences exist.

- Read and discuss: 1. Poem
  - 2. Emancipation Story JIS

NB: At the end of term one ALL grade 5 classes must plan an exhibition of various aspects of Caribbean History and culture using the information gathered on the subject. The exhibition must include performances, demonstrations and samples of food, drink, national dress, anthems, symbols etc.

#### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Which world religions are present in the Caribbean?

Locate from a variety of sources – factual information about major world religious phenomena present in the Caribbean

- Name world religions/belief systems in the Caribbean
- Identify countries of origin of these religions/beliefs
- Find out how the first 4 major world religion come to Jamaica and the Caribbean
- Locate countries in the Caribbean where there are large concentrations of world religions
- Identify differences and similarities in belief and value of World religions
- Identify by sight places of worship of these religions
- Identify religious celebrations that take place in the Caribbean
- Identify special garments, foods, symbols and ritual associated with World religions.
- Identify values that guide the lives of religious people.
